- Provided food items such as Gari, Oil, and Rice to vulnerable.
- Provided shelter, blanket and mats to displaced women and children.
- Provided food packs to NCS staff, Caritas Staff, Catholic health Frontline workers
- Distributed hygiene materials such as "veronica buckets" soaps, disinfectants, tissue, hand sanitizers etc. to hospitals and clinics.
- Promoted virtual communication with regional teams.
- Examined and mitigated potential risks in affected areas, through comprehensive training of personnel, Caritas Ghana staff, Diocesan Caritas staff traditional leaders, religious leaders,
- and other opinion leaders and by ensuring access to safe and appropriate information on how to prevent the virus.
- Provided detergent to the remote Catholic Health Service providers in the four Archdioceses.
- 800 workers of Health facilities in the remote areas of the four archdioceses provided with face mask, and other Personal Protective Equipment.
